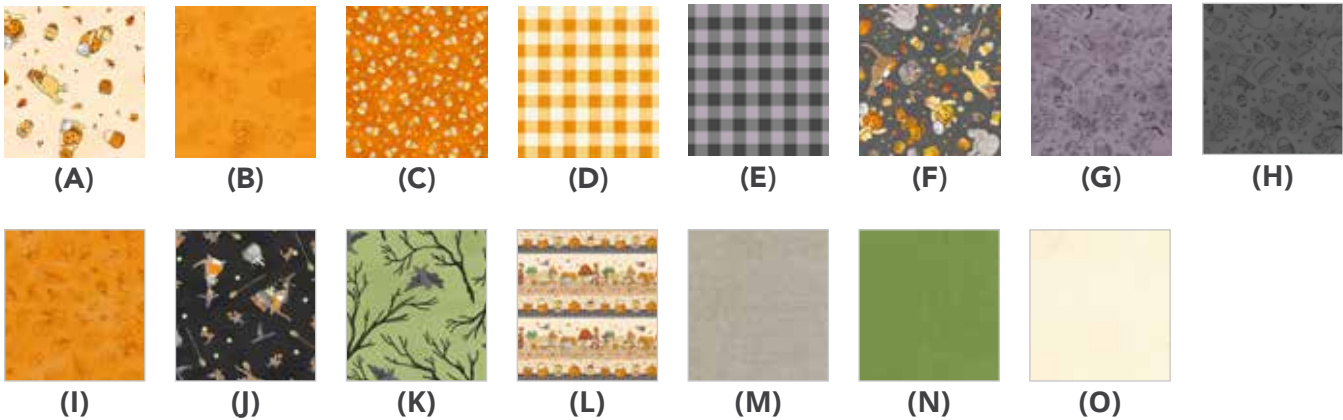

Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check studiofabrics.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
- *Strips cut Length of Fabric (LOF).

Fabric A, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (8) 1½" x 14½"

Fabric B, cut:

- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" squares

Fabric C, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (6) 6½" squares

Fabric D, cut:

- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" squares

Fabric E, cut:

- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" squares

Fabric F, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (6) 6½" squares

Fabric G, cut:

- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" squares

Fabric H, cut:

- (4) 2½" x WOF. Sew together end to end and cut (2) 2½" x 68½"
- (3) 2½" x WOF. Sew together end to end and cut (2) 2½" x 52½"
- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (8) 1½" x 14½"

Fabric I, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (8) 1½" x 14½"
- (8) 2½" x WOF for the binding

Fabric J, cut:

- (4) 4½" x WOF. Sew together end to end and cut (2) 4½" x 72½"
- (4) 4½" x WOF. Sew together end to end and cut (2) 4½" x 60½"

Fabric K, cut:

- (4) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" x 6½"
- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (24) 3½" squares

Trick or Treat Quilt

Fabric L, fussy cut:

- (1) 6½" x 48½" LOF* centered on the main design motif
- (2) 3½" x 48½" LOF* each centered on a pumpkin stripe

Fabric M, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
(12) 1½" x 12½"
- (6) 1½" x WOF; subcut
(12) 1½" x 14½"

Fabric N, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
(12) 1½" x 12½"
- (6) 1½" x WOF; subcut
(12) 1½" x 14½"

Fabric O, cut:

- (4) 3½" x WOF; subcut
(24) 3½" x 6½"
- (3) 3½" x WOF; subcut
(24) 3½" squares

Sewing

- Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- Place (1) 3½" **Fabric D** square on the left side of (1) 3½" x 6½" **Fabric K** strip RST (**Fig. 1**). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (**Fig. 1**). Flip open the triangle formed and press (**Fig. 2**). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.

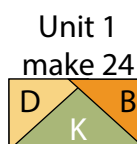


- Place (1) 3½" **Fabric B** square on the right side of the 3½" x 6½" **Fabric K** strip RST (**Fig. 3**). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (**Fig. 3**). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (**Fig. 4**).
- Repeat Steps 1-2 to make an additional (23) Unit 1 strips.

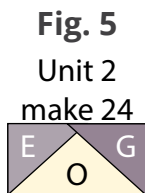

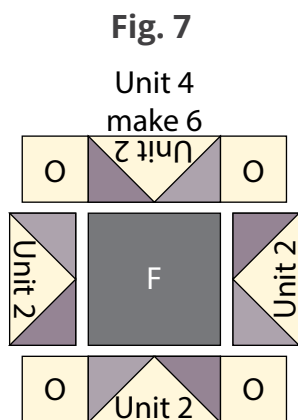
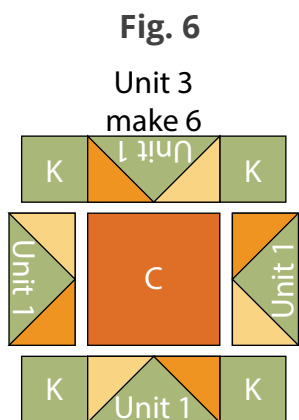
Trick or Treat Quilt

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to **Figure 5** for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (24) Unit 2 strips.

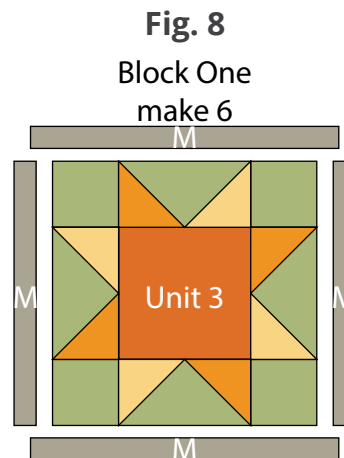


5. Sew (1) 3½" **Fabric K** square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 6½" **Fabric C** square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12½" Unit 3 square (**Fig. 6**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Unit 3 squares.

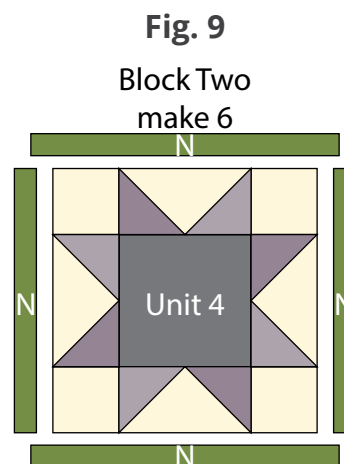
6. Sew (1) 3½" **Fabric O** square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 6½" **Fabric F** square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12½" Unit 4 square (**Fig. 7**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Unit 4 squares.



7. Sew (1) 1½" x 12½" **Fabric M** strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square. Sew (1) 1½" x 14½" **Fabric M** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 3 square to make (1) 14½" Block One square (**Fig. 8**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Block One squares.



8. Sew (1) 1½" x 12½" **Fabric N** strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) 1½" x 14½" **Fabric N** strip to the top and bottom of the Unit 4 square to make (1) 14½" Block Two square (**Fig. 9**). Repeat to make an additional (5) Block Two squares.



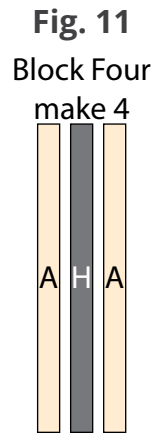
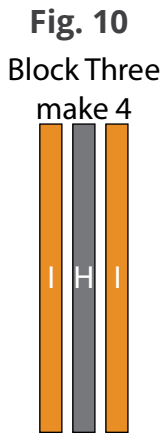

Trick or Treat Quilt

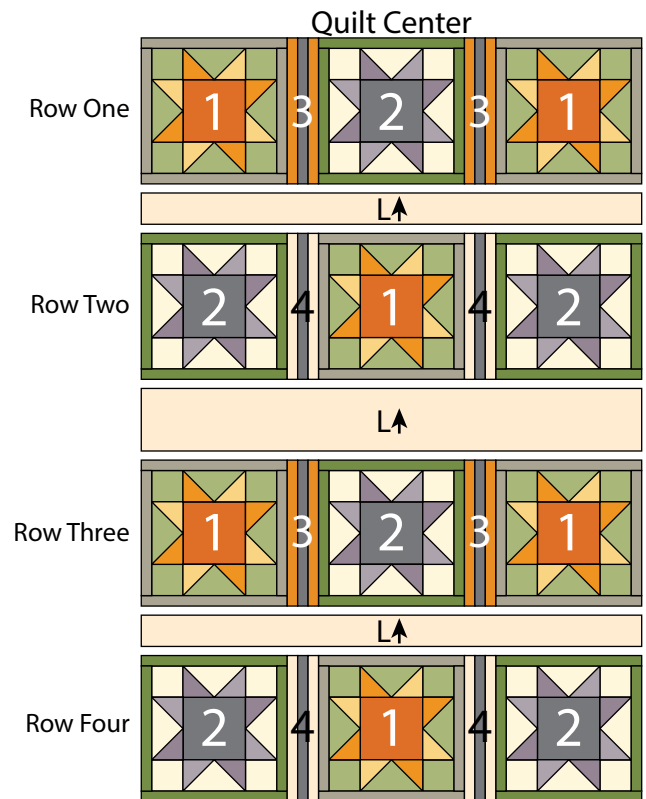
- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric I** strip to each side of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric H** strip lengthwise to make (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Three rectangle (**Fig. 10**). Repeat to make an additional (3) Block Three rectangles.
- Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip to each side of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric H** strip lengthwise to make (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $14\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Four rectangle (**Fig. 11**). Repeat to make an additional (3) Block Four rectangles.



- Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three rectangle, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three rectangle and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (**Fig. 12**). Repeat to make Row Three.
- Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Four rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Four rectangle and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (**Fig. 12**). Repeat to make Row Four.
- Sew together Row One, (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric L** strip, (1) Row Two, (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric L** strip, Row Three, (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric L** strip and Row Four, lengthwise and

in that order from top to bottom, to make the $48\frac{1}{2}$ " x $68\frac{1}{2}$ " Quilt Center (**Fig. 12**).

Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout (Page 9) while assembling the quilt top.

- Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $68\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric H** strip to each side of the Quilt Center. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric H** strip to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center.
- Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $72\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** strip to each side of the Quilt Center. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $60\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric J** strip to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center to complete the quilt top which should measure $60\frac{1}{2}$ " x $80\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

16. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.

Binding

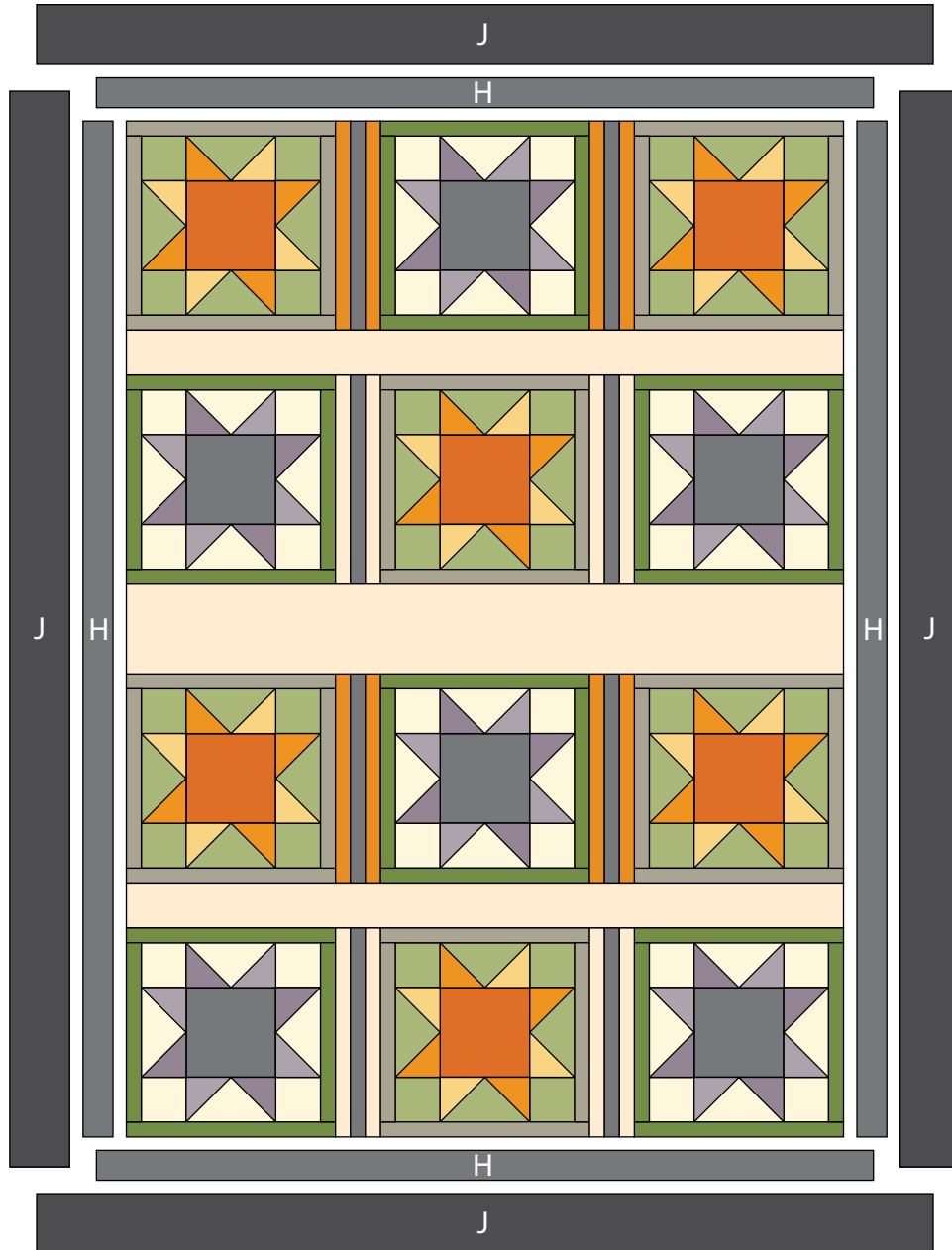
17. Sew together (7) 2½" x WOF **Fabric I** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
18. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
19. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
20. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.
