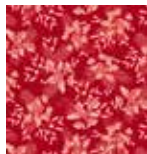

Runner Cutting Instructions

Notes:

- Please make sure to check *studioefabrics.net* for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.
- *Strips cut Length of Fabric (LOF).

Fabric A, cut:

(1) 6½" x 42½", piece as needed.

Fabric B, cut:

(1) 1½" x WOF; subcut

(2) 1½" x 6½"

(3) 1½" x WOF; sew together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1½" x 44½"

Fabric C, cut:

(1) 1½" x WOF; subcut

(2) 1½" x 8½"

(3) 1½" x WOF; sew together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1½" x 46½"

(5) 2½" x WOF for the binding

Fabric D, fussy cut:

(2) 7½" x 28" LOF* centered on the stripe

(2) 7½" x 64" LOF* centered on the stripe

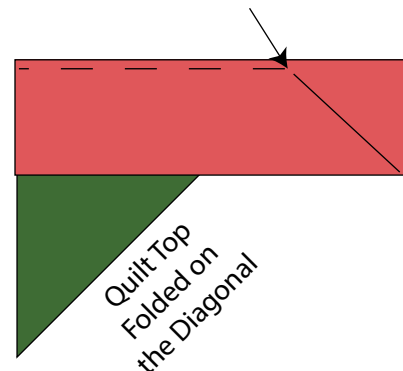
Runner Assembly

- Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
- The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

Follow the Runner Layout in Figure 2 (Page 5) while assembling the runner top.

1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric B** strip to each side of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric A** strip. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric B** strip to the top and bottom of the **Fabric A** strip to Runner Center.
2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric C** strip to each side of the Runner Center. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $46\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric C** strip to the top and bottom of the Runner Center.
3. Center (1) $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28" **Fabric D** strip on (1) side of the Runner Center and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
4. Repeat Step 3 to sew (1) $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x 64" **Fabric D** strip to the top and to the bottom of the Runner Center, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Runner Center on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (**Fig. 1**).

5. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in **Figure 1**), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to complete the runner top which should measure $60\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

6. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and runner top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the runner.

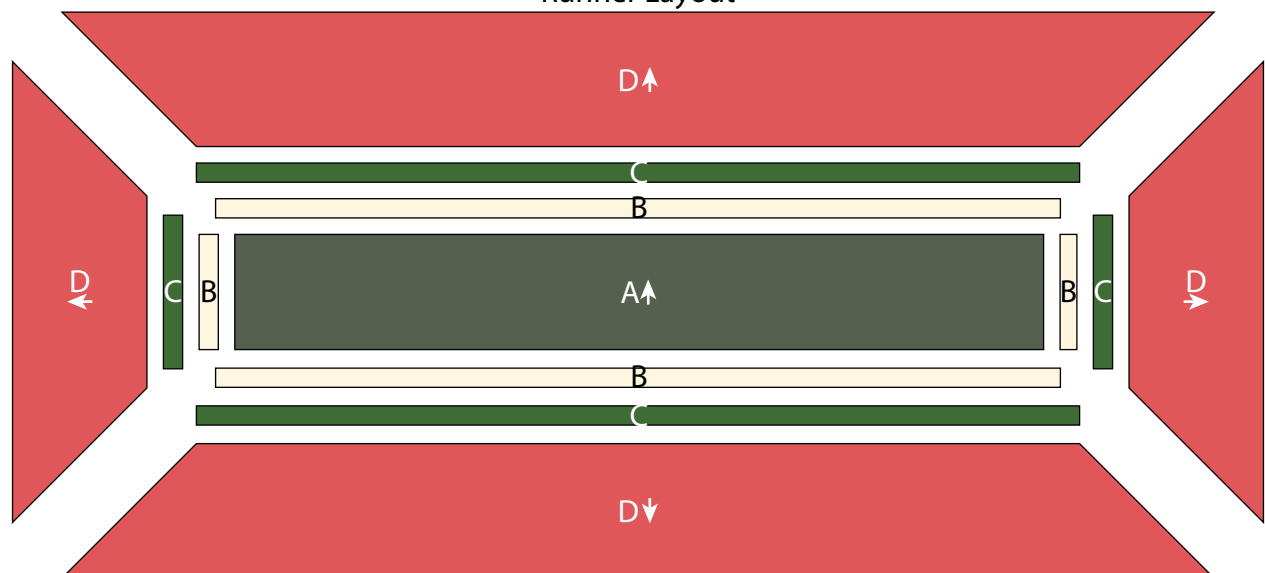
Binding

7. Sew together (5) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF **Fabric C** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
8. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the runner top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the runner top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately

- 12" from where you started and backstitch.
9. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the runner edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the runner top.
 10. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the runner and hand or machine stitch in place.

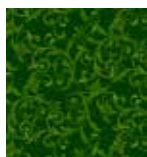

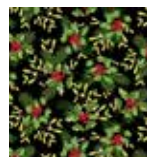

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Place Mat Cutting Instructions

Notes:

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- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric F, cut:

- (1) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (2) 3½" x 18½"

Fabric G, cut:

- (1) 3½" x WOF; subcut
- (2) 3½" x 18½"

Fabric A, cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 4" x 18½"

Fabric B, cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 4" x 18½"

Fabric C, cut:

- (4) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (8) 1½" x 18½"

Fabric D, cut:

- (2) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 1½" x 18½"
- (4) 2½" x WOF strips for (2) bindings

Fabric E, cut:

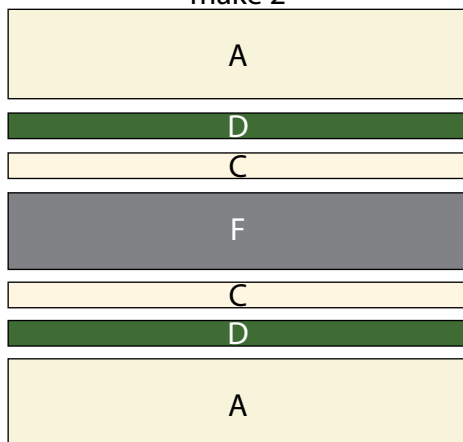
- (2) 1½" x WOF; subcut
- (4) 1½" x 18½"
- (4) 2½" x WOF strips for (2) bindings

Place Mat Assembly

- Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.
 - The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.
- Sew together (1) 4" x 18½" **Fabric A** strip, (1) 1½" x 18½" **Fabric D** strip, (1) 1½" x 18½" **Fabric C** strip, (1) 3½" x 18½" **Fabric F** strip, (1) 1½" x 18½" **Fabric C** strip, (1) 1½" x 18½" **Fabric D** strip and (1) 4" x 18½" **Fabric A** strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) 18½" x 14½" Place Mat Layout #1 (**Fig. 3**). Repeat to make a second Place Mat Layout #1.

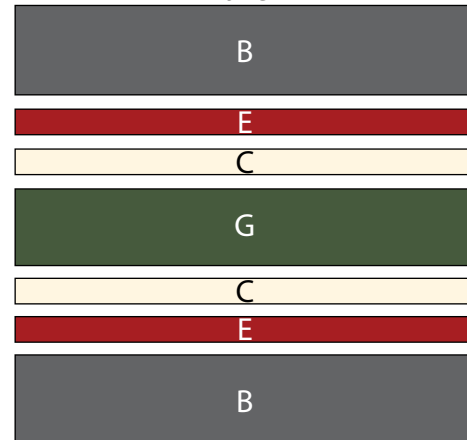

- Repeat Step 1 and refer **Figure 4** for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Place Mat Layout #2's.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

- Layer (1) backing (wrong side up), (1) batting, and (1) place mat top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the place mat.

Binding

- Sew together (4) 2½" x WOF **Fabric E** binding strips end to end with diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together. Cut the strip into equal pieces.
- Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of (1) place mat top #1, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the place mat top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
- Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the place mat edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves

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and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the place mat top.

7. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the place mat and hand or machine stitch in place.
8. Repeat Steps 5-7 with the second **Fabric E** binding strip and place mat top #1.
9. Repeat Steps 4-7 while using the **Fabric D** binding strips and (2) place mat top #2's.

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
