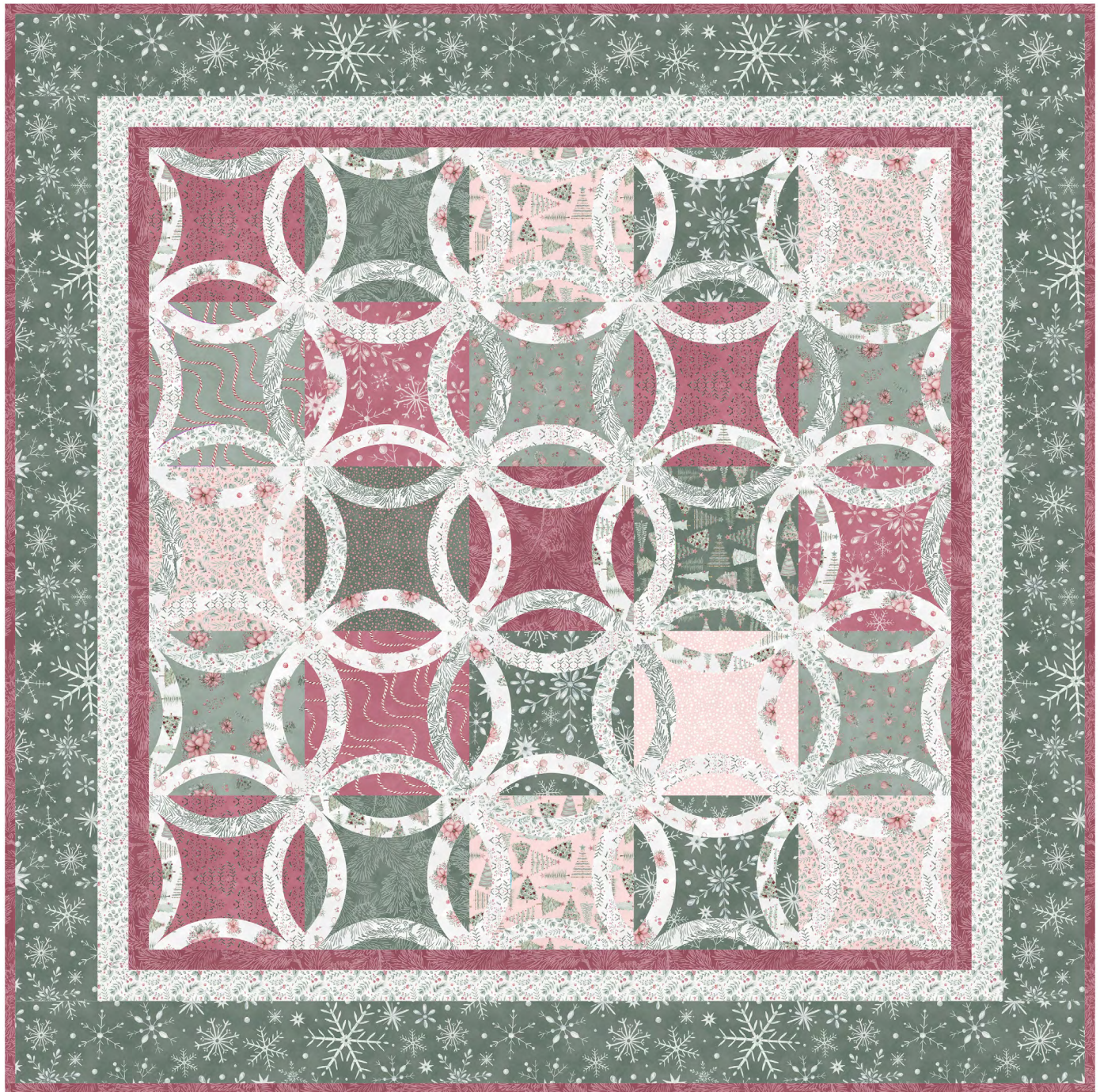


Infinity Lap Quilt

(A) Holiday Foliage	Pearl	9038-11	¾ yard (0.34m)
(B) Pine Etching	Auburn	9042-33*	¾ yard (0.69m)
(C) Snow Crystals	Hunter	9043-65	¾ yard (0.69m)
(D) Wedding Ring Running Yardage	Christmas	9046-102	1¼ yards (1.14m)

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CUTTING

Notes:

- Please make sure to check *studiofabrics.net* for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvedge to selvedge edge unless otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

(5) 2" x WOF for border 2

Fabric B, cut:

(6) 2½" x WOF for binding

(5) 1½" x WOF for border 1

Fabric C, cut:

(5) 4½" x WOF for border 3

Fabric D, cut:

Fussy cut (1) 39½" x 39½" square

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

Notes:

- All seam allowances are ¼" (0.64cm). Sew pieces with right sides together.
 - Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.
 - Follow the **Quilt Layout** Diagram (page 4) while assembling the quilt top.
1. For border 1, trim (2) 1½" **Fabric B** strips to 39½". Sew one strip to each side of the 39½" x 39½" **Fabric D** square and press the seams toward the borders. Sew (3) 1½" **Fabric B** strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut (2) border strips to that length (approx. 41½") and sew one to the top and bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.
 2. For border 2, sew (5) 2" **Fabric A** strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the vertical length of the quilt top through the center and cut (2) border strips to that length (approx. 41½"). Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top and press the seams toward the borders. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center. Cut (2) border strips to that length (approx. 44½") and sew one to the top and bottom. Press the seams toward the borders.
 3. Repeat step 2 with (5) 4½" **Fabric C** strips to make and add border 3. Cut strips to approx. 44½" and 52½", respectively.

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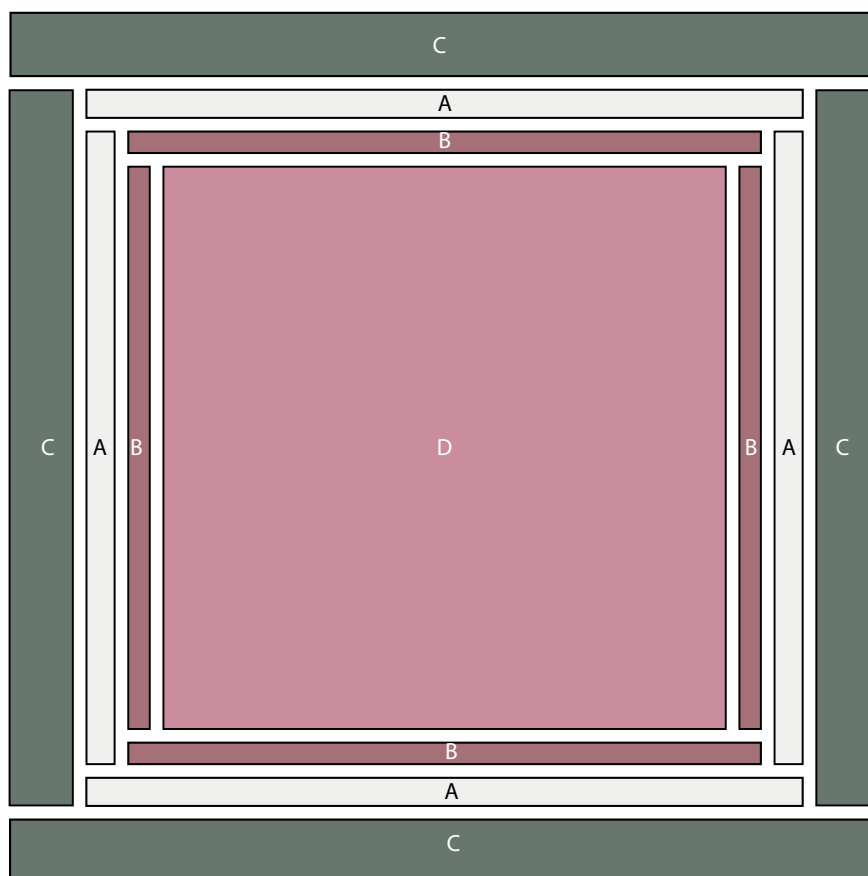

FINISHING

4. Sew together the (6) 2½" **Fabric B** binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half with the wrong sides together.
5. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of the quilt.
6. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match the raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
7. Lay both loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, with the right sides matching. Trim the seam to ¼" and press it open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt.
8. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.
