Cutting

Notes:

- Please make sure to check www.studioefabrics.net for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless
 otherwise noted.

Fabric A, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric B, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric C, cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48½" strips
- (2) 2" x WOF; subcut (2) 2" x 37½" strips

Fabric D, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric E, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric F, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric G, cut:

(1) 4½" x WOF; subcut (4) 4½" squares

Fabric H, cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45½" strips
- (2) 2" x WOF; subcut
 - (2) 2" x 34½" strips

Fabric I, cut:

(3) 4½" x WOF. Sew the strips together end to end with 45-degree diagonal seams and cut (2) 4½" x 48½" strips

Fabric J, fussy cut:

(1) $34\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle centered over the motif


Fabric K, cut:

(6) 21/2" x WOF for the binding

Quilt Top Assembly

Note:

- All seam allowances are ¼" (.64cm) unless otherwise noted.
- Sew pieces right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.
- Follow the Quilt Assembly Diagram (page 5) while assembling the quilt top.
- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 34½" **Fabric H** strip to the right and left sides of the 34½" x 42½" **Fabric J** rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 45½" **Fabric H** strip to the top and bottom.
- 2. Sew (1) 2 x 37½" **Fabric C** strip to the right and left sides of the panel unit from step 1. Sew (1) 2" x 48½" **Fabric C** strip to the top and bottom.
- 3. Sew together (2) each 4½" **Fabric G**, **F**, **E**, **B**, **A** and **D** squares to make a pieced row (**Fig. 1**). Make (2). Sew to the top and bottom.




4. Sew (1) 4½" x 48½" **Fabric I** strip to the top and bottom to make the quilt top, which measures 48½" x 56½".

Finishing

- 5. Sew together the (6) 2½" x WOF **Fabric K** binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 6. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top.
- 7. Leaving an 8" tail of binding and beginning along an edge of the quilt top, match raw edges of the binding to the raw edges of the quilt top. Sew the binding to the outside edge around all four sides and miter corners. Stop sewing approximately 12" from where you started and backstitch.
- 8. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along the quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back onto themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together, right sides matching. Trim seam to ¼" and press seam open. Finish sewing the binding to the quilt top.
- 9. Turn the binding over the raw edge to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.
