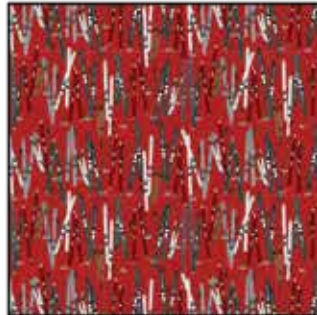

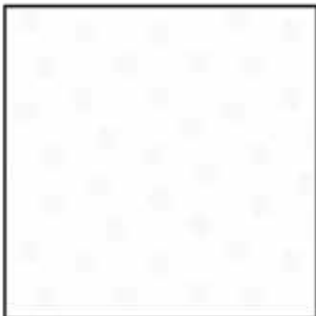

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

**Fabric A (6379-1W Alpine Ski Blocks – White):**

- Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

**Fabric B (6387-79 Tone-on-Tone Alpine Trees – Dark Slate Blue), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ½" strips.

**Fabric C (6378-1 Ski Slope Scenic – White), cut:**

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

**Fabric D (6381-1 Mountain Cable Car – White), cut:**

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

**Fabric E (6384-90 Tossed Skiers – Gray), cut:**

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.

**Fabric F (6385-98 Snowflakes – Gray/Red), cut:**

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

**Fabric G (6385-88 Snowflakes – Red), cut:**

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" squares.

**Fabric H (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! – Red Delicious), cut:**

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Fabric I (Storm Cloud-87 Peppered Cottons – Storm Cloud), cut:**

- (11) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

**Fabric J (6380-17 Assorted Ski Accessories – Blue Gray), cut:**

- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 58 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 6 ½" x 56 ½" strips.

**Backing (6382-88 Lined Up Ski's – Red), cut:**

- (2) 78" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 64" x 78" to make the back.

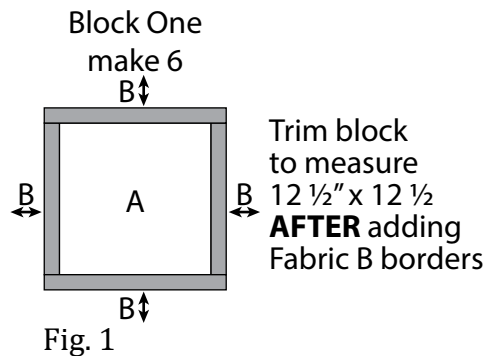
## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

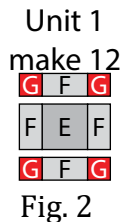
### Block Assembly

**Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

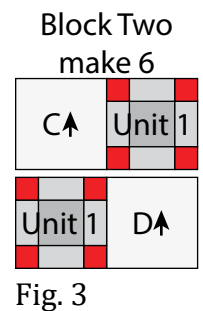
1. Sew (1) 2" x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



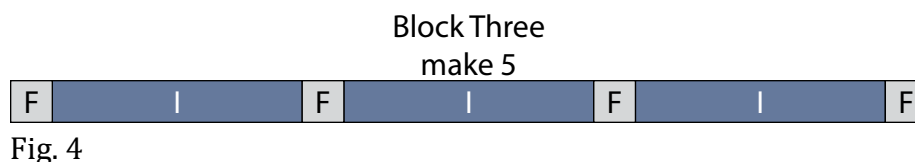
2. Sew (1) 2" Fabric G square to each end of (1) 2" x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) 2" x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.



3. Sew (1) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to the left side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (12) 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



4. Sew (4) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares and (3) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strips together end to end and alternating them from left to right to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (5) Block Three strips total.



5. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip together in that order from left to right to make Row One (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Three.

6. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip together in that order from left to right to make Row Two (Fig. 5). Repeat to make Row Four.

7. Sew the (5) Block Three strips and (4) Pieced Rows from Steps 5-6, in numerical order, together lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom to make the 44 ½" x 58 ½" Center Block (Fig. 5).

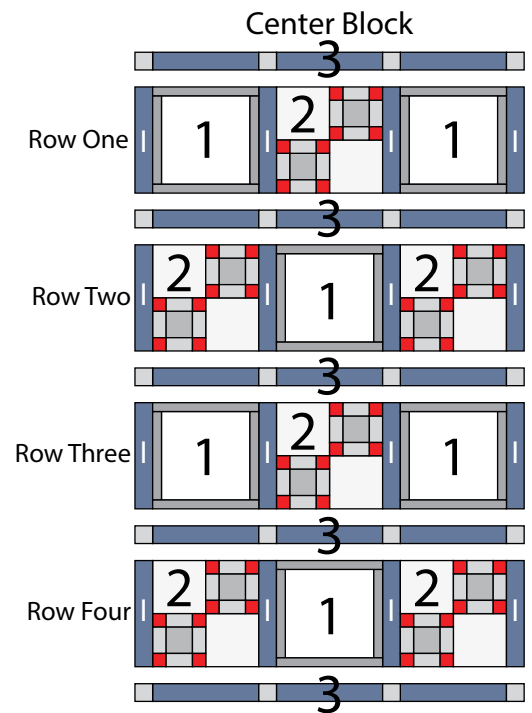

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

8. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 58 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

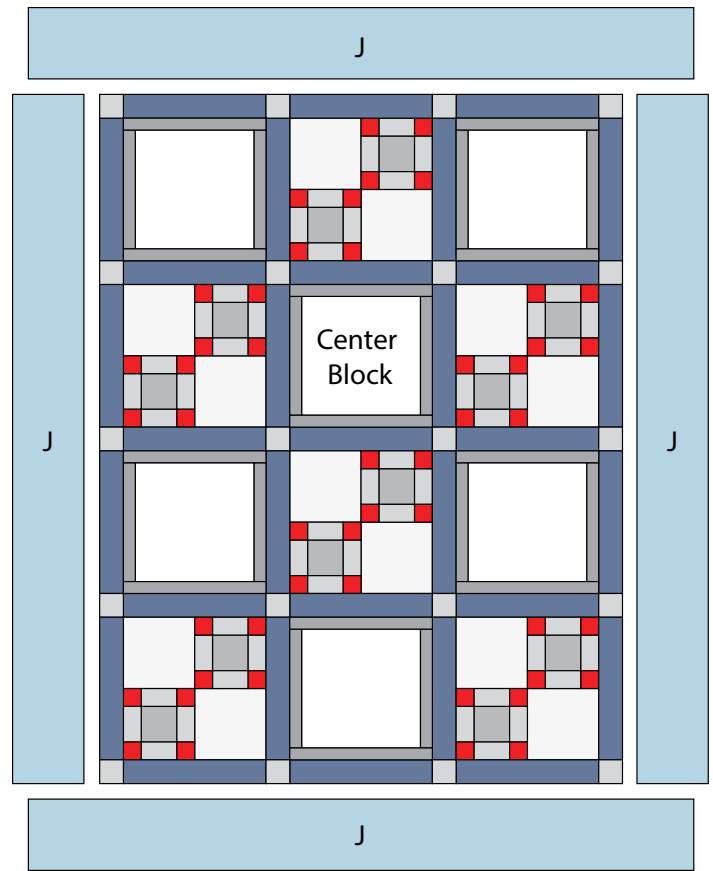
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

9. Press the quilt top and 64" x 78" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

10. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric H binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

11. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
