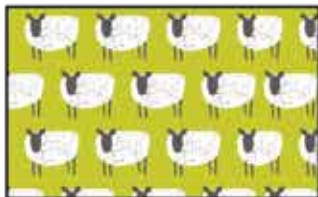

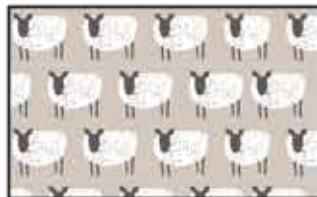

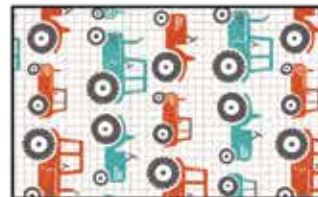

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4323P-86 36" Panel – Multi):

- Fussy cut (1) 35" x 43" panel.

Fabric B (1351-Red Just Color! – Red), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43" strips.
- (2) 2" x 38" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 46 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (4329-11 Cows – Turquoise), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (10) 4 ⅞" squares.

Fabric D (4330-2 Pigs – White), cut:

- (2) 4 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (10) 4 ⅞" squares.

Fabric E (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

Fabric F (4330-39 Pigs – Brown), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips.

Fabric G (4333-8 Vegetables – White), cut:

- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4" x 54 ½" strips.
- (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4" x 46 ½" strips.

Fabric H (4327-39 Words – Chocolate), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4" squares.

Backing (4329-88 Cows – Red), cut:

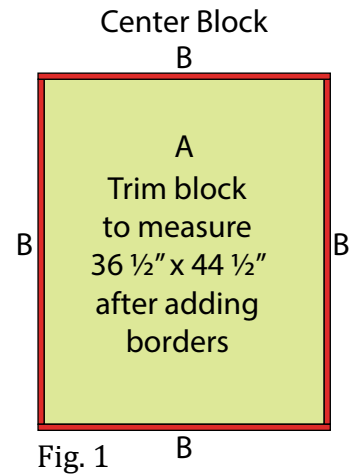
- (2) 61" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 61" x 69" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 35" x 43" Fabric A panel.
Sew (1) 2" x 38" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel.
Trim the block to measure $36\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).



2. Place (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square on top of (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the blocks to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to make (2) Block One squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (20) Block One squares total.

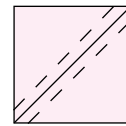

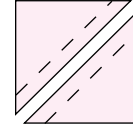

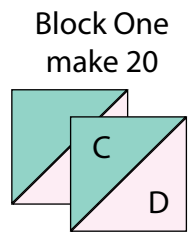

3. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric E strip to the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric F strip lengthwise to make (1) EF strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (3) EF strips total.

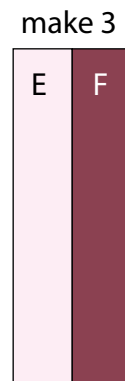

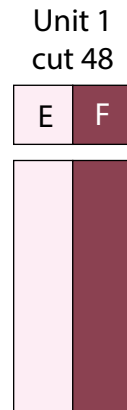

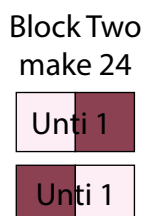

4. Cut the EF strips into (48) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 strips (Fig. 6).

5. Sew (2) Unit 1 strips together as shown in Figure 7 to make (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make (24) Block Two squares total

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

6. Sew (3) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares together to make (1) Side Strip. Repeat to make (4) Side Strips total.
7. Sew (1) Side Strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
8. Sew (6) Block One squares and (5) Block Two squares together alternating them. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Sew (1) 4" x 54 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4" Fabric H square to each end of (1) 4" x 46 ½" Fabric G strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

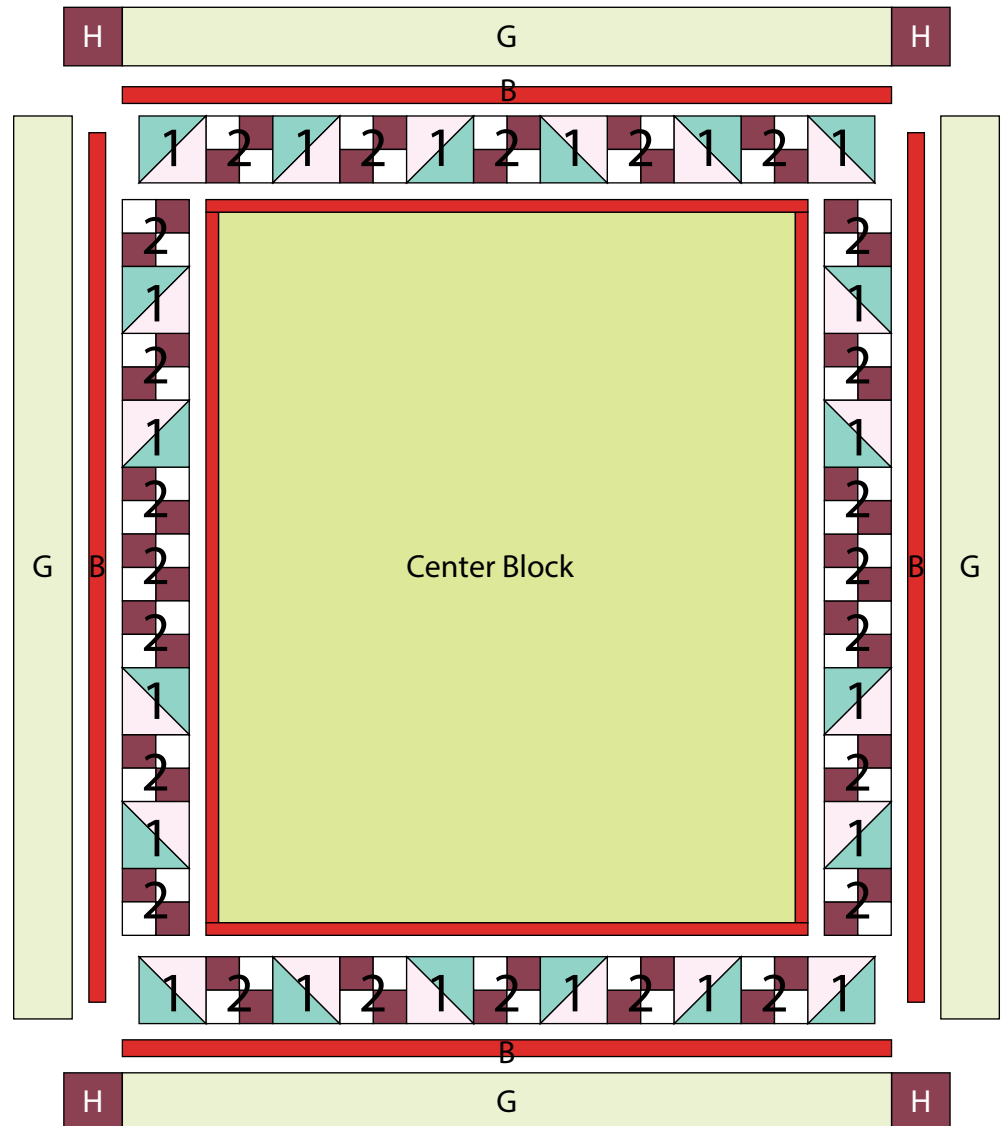
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and 61" x 69" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

12. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
