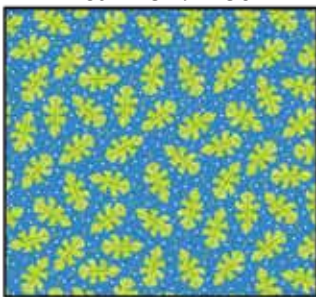

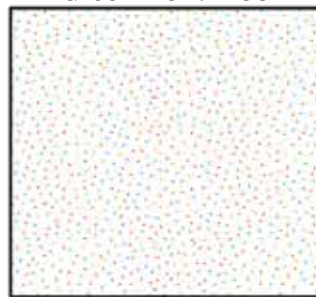

## Cutting

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

**Fabric A (6799-77 Double Animal Border – Multi), fussy cut:**

- (1) 12 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strip, centered on animals.
- (2) 1 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strips, each centered on blue without animals.

**Fabric B (6800-63 Novelty Animal Stripe – Multi):**

- Fussy cut (2) 4 ½" x 48 ½" LOF strips, each centered on a stripe.

**Fabric C (6791-60 Tossed Animals – Teal), cut:**

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

**Fabric D (6801-77 Flag Banner – Multi):**

- Fussy cut (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

**Fabric E (True Cheddar-36 Peppered Cottons – True Cheddar), cut:**

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 3 ½" squares.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ½" x 48 ½" strips.

**Fabric F (6796-186 Tiny Dots on White – Multi), cut:**

- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

**Fabric G (6794-11 Leaves – Blue), cut:**

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.

**Fabric H (6792-66 Tossed Owls – Green), cut:**

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.

**Fabric I (6793-1 Tossed Flags – Multi), cut:**

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric J (6795-77 Tossed Monkey – Navy), cut:**

- (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ½" squares.

**Fabric K (6797-77 Tiny Dots on Navy – Navy), cut:**

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Backing (6791-88 Tossed Animals – Red), cut:**

- (2) 56" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 56" x 66" to make the back.

## Sewing

Sew using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### Block Assembly

**Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.**

1. Place (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the left side of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (16) Unit 1 strips total.

2. Place (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the right side of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (16) Unit 2 strips total.

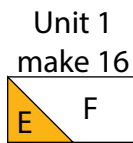

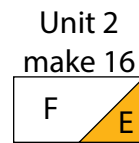

3. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 5 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Unit 4 squares.

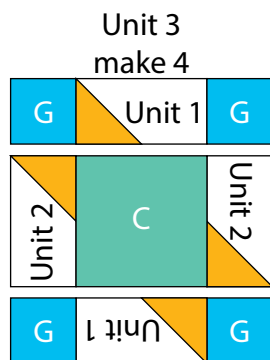

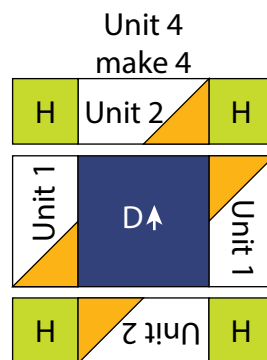

5. Sew together (2) Unit 3 squares and (2) Unit 4 squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 6).

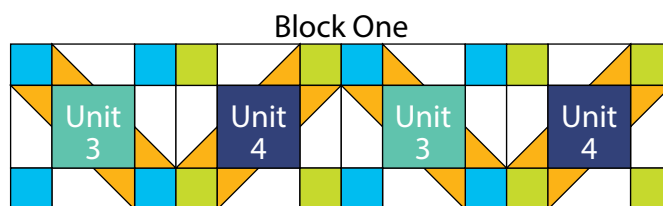

6. Sew together (2) Unit 4 squares and (2) Unit 3 squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Block Two strip (Fig. 7).

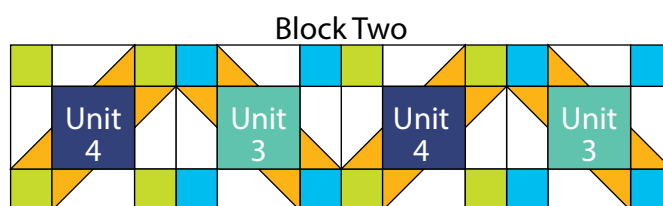

7. Sew together (6) 4 1/2" Fabric I squares and (6) 4 1/2" Fabric J squares, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 8).

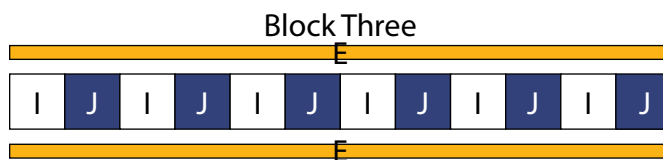

8. Sew together (6) 4 1/2" Fabric J squares and (6) 4 1/2" Fabric I squares, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Four strip (Fig. 9).

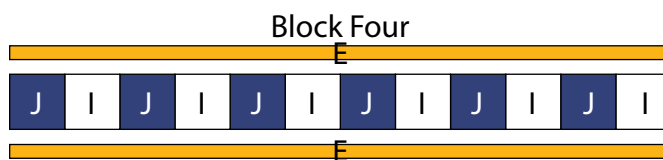

## Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

9. Sew together (1) 4 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric B strip, (1) 1 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) Block One strip, (1) Block Three strip, (1) 12 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric A strip, (1) Block Four strip, (1) Block Two strip, (1) 1 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric A strip and (1) 4 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric B strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.

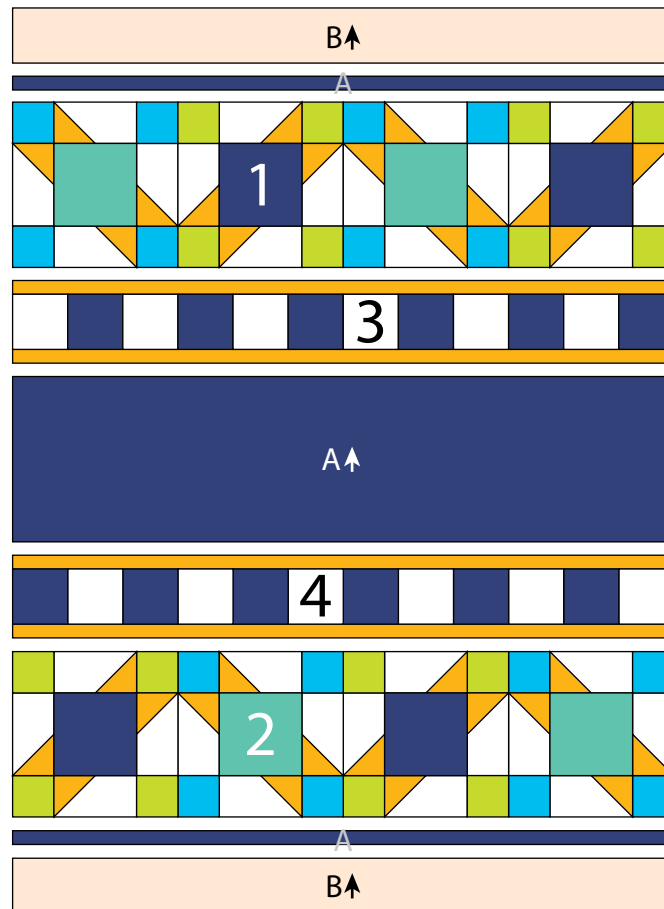
## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

10. Press the quilt top and 56" x 66" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

## Binding

11. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric K binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

12. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
