Cutting - Table Topper

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5777-17 Bird and Flower Blocks – Sky Blue):

- Fussy cut (4) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Grape Just Color! – Grape), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 28 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 30 ½" WOF strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (5773-17 Nasturtiums – Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (16) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric D (5771-55 Hummingbird Allover – Purple), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (32) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric E (5772-01 Splashy Texture – Multi Bright), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric F (1351-Powder Pink Just Color! – Powder Pink), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (32) 4 ¾" triangles.
- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares.

Fabric G (5780-77 Hummingbird Swirl – Navy), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares.

Fabric H (5775-77 Arabesque – Royal), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric I (5776-17 Medallion – Sky Blue), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 30 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 5 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

Backing (5771-77 Hummingbird Allover – Royal), cut:

- (2) 48" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 48" x 48" to make the back.

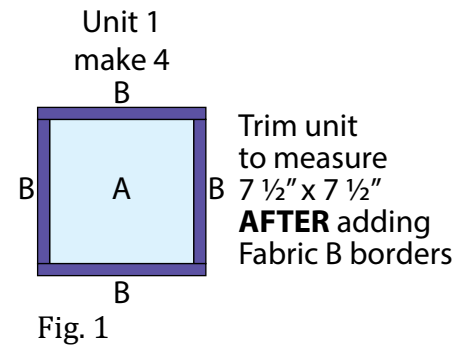
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

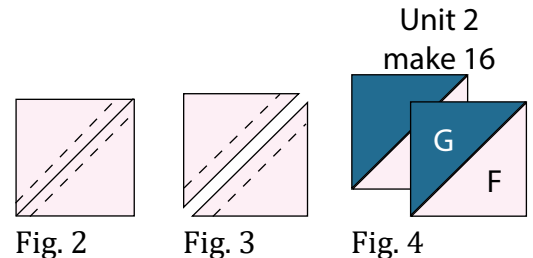
Table Topper Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

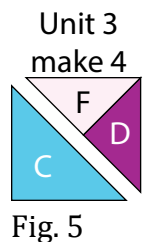
1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.



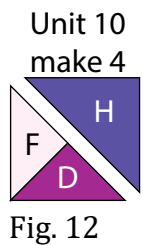
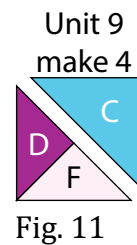
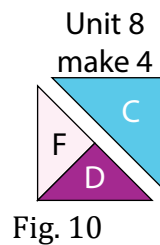
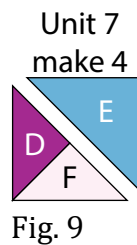
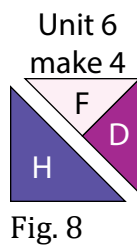
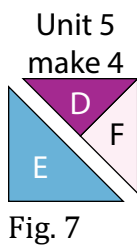
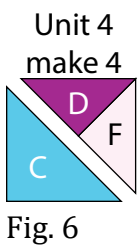
2. Place (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F square on top of (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 4" square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (16) Unit 2 squares total.



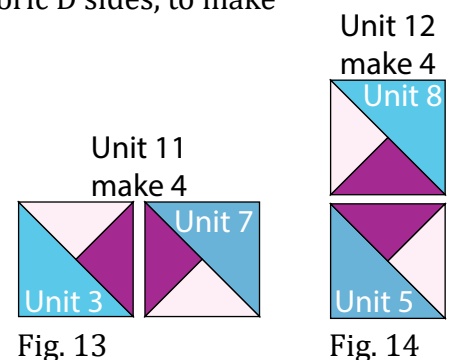
3. Sew (1) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle and (1) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle together. Sew (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric C triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). The unit should measure 4" square. Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.



4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 6-12 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (4) of each unit square for Unit 4 through Unit 10.



5. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the left side of (1) Unit 7 square, along the Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 strips total.



6. Sew (1) Unit 8 square to the top of (1) Unit 5 square, along the Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 12 strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (4) Unit 12 strips total.

7. Sew (1) Unit 10 square to the top of (1) Unit 4 square, along the Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 13 strip (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (4) Unit 13 strips total.

8. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the left side of (1) Unit 9 square, along the Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 14 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (4) Unit 14 strips total.

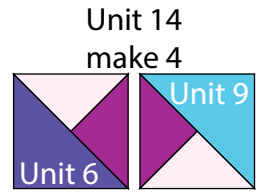

9. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each end of (1) Unit 11 strip to make the top row (Fig. 17).

10. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip, (1) Unit 1 square and (1) Unit 13 strip together in that order left to right to make the middle row (Fig. 17).

11. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each end of (1) Unit 14 strip to make the bottom row (Fig. 17).

12. Sew the (3) rows from Steps 9-11 together lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 17). The block should measure $14\frac{1}{2}'' \times 14\frac{1}{2}''$. Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

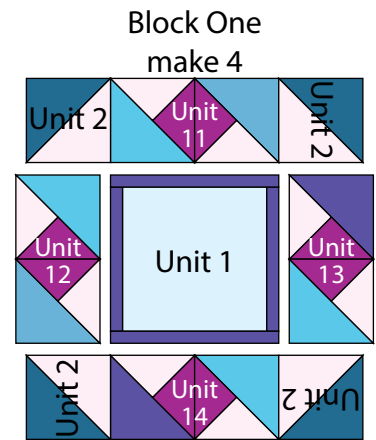

13. Sew the (4) Block One squares together into a 2 x 2 matrix to make the $28\frac{1}{2}''$ Table Topper Center Block (Fig. 18).

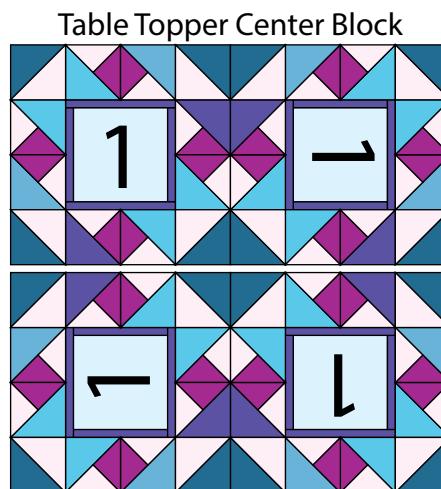

Table Topper Assembly

(Follow the Table Topper Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $28\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the Table Topper top.

Table Topper Layering, Quilting and Finishing

16. Press the table topper top and 48" x 48" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Table Topper Binding

17. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

18. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.

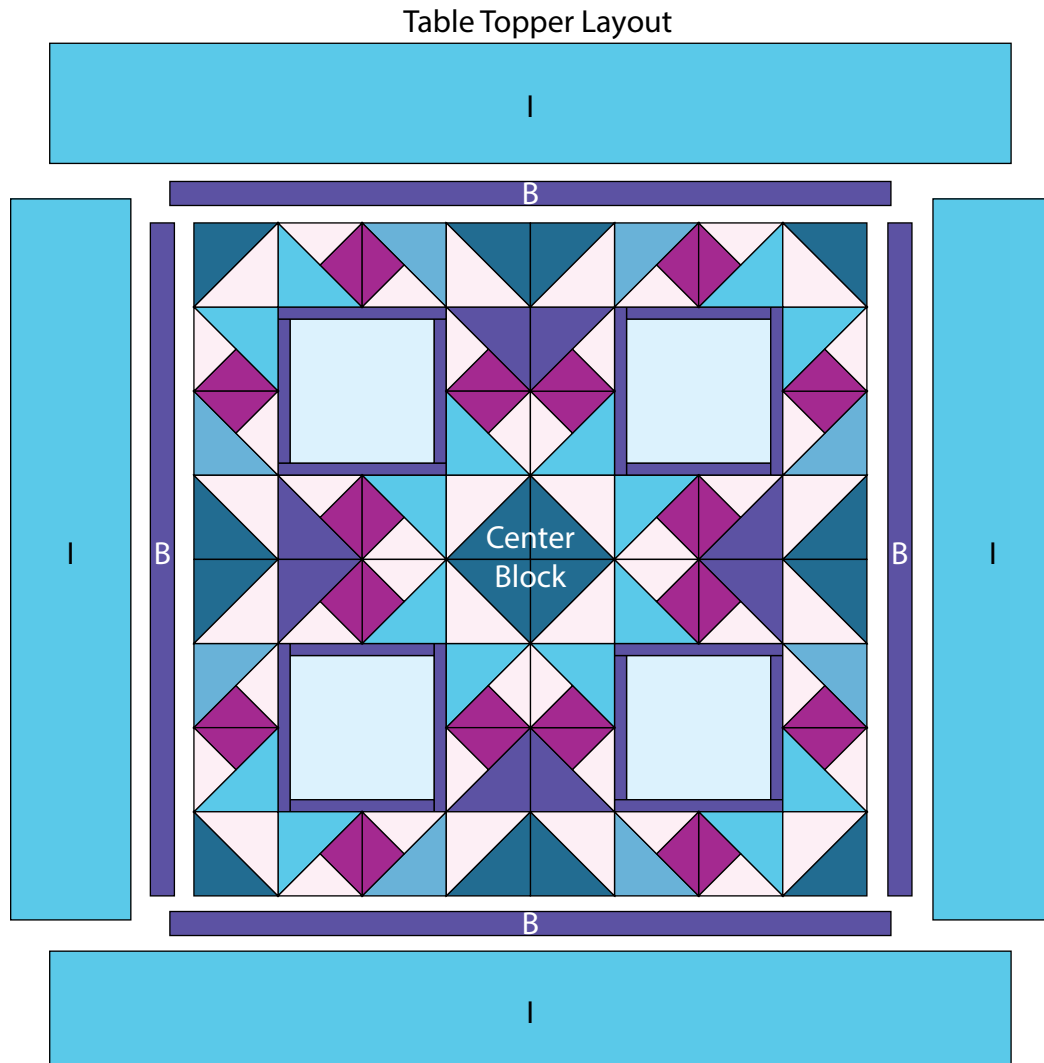

Cutting - Place Mats

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5777-17 Bird and Flower Blocks – Sky Blue):

- Fussy cut (4) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Grape Just Color! – Grape), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (5773-17 Nasturtiums – Sky Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (16) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric D (5771-55 Hummingbird Allover – Purple), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (32) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric E (5775-77 Arabesque – Royal), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (16) 4 ¾" triangles.

Fabric F (1351-Powder Pink Just Color! – Powder Pink), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (32) 4 ¾" triangles.
- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares.

Fabric G (5780-77 Hummingbird Swirl – Navy), cut:

- (1) 4 ¾" x WOF strip, sub-cut (8) 4 ¾" squares.

Fabric H (5781-17 Flower Dot – Sky Blue), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 2 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

Backing (5771-77 Hummingbird Allover – Royal), cut:

- (2) 22" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 22" x 18" rectangles to make the backs.

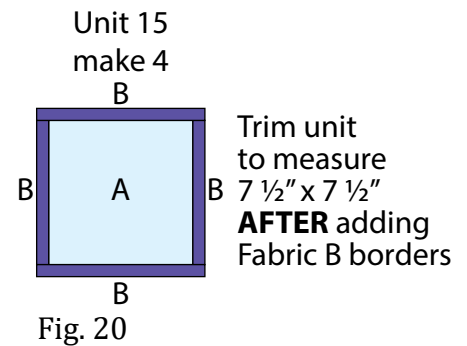
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

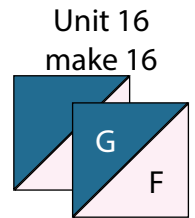
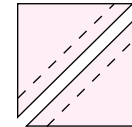
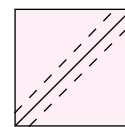
Place Mat Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

19. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 15 square (Fig. 20). **Trim the unit to measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (4) Unit 15 squares total.

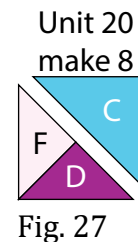
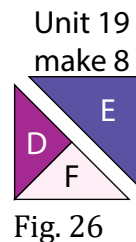
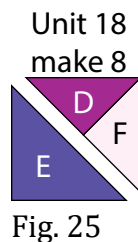
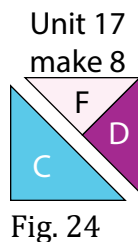


20. Place (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric F square on top of (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 21). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 21). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 22) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 4" square to make (2) Unit 16 squares (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (16) Unit 16 squares total.



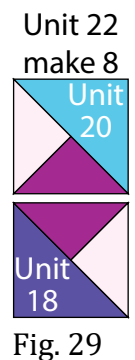
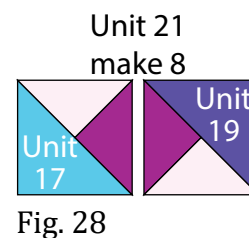
21. Sew (1) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle and (1) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle together. Sew (1) $4\frac{3}{8}$ " Fabric C triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 24). The unit should measure 4" square. Repeat to make (8) Unit 17 squares total.

22. Repeat Step 21 and refer to Figures 25-27 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (8) of each unit square for Unit 18 through Unit 20.



23. Sew (1) Unit 17 square to the left side of (1) Unit 19 square, along their Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 21 strip (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (8) Unit 21 strips total.

24. Sew (1) Unit 20 square to the top of (1) Unit 18 square, along their Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 22 strip (Fig. 29). Repeat to make (8) Unit 22 strips total.



25. Sew (1) Unit 16 square to each end of (1) Unit 21 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 22 strip to each side of (1) Unit 15 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 30). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

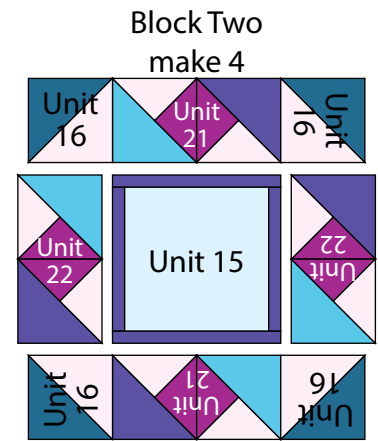

26. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Block Two square to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 31). Repeat to make (4) Place Mat tops total.

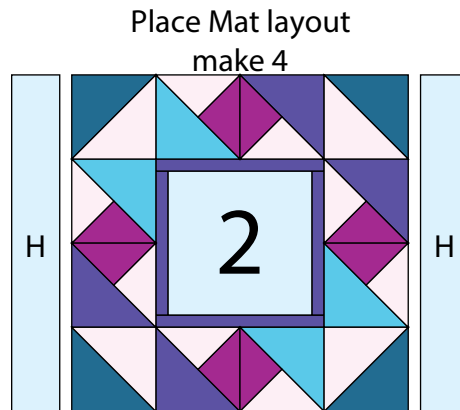

Place Mat Layering, Quilting and Finishing

27. Press the place mats and 22" x 18" backings well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed place mat tops (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Place Mat Binding

28. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together. Cut the strip into (4) equal pieces.

29. Sew the binding to the front of each place mat, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
