- (A) 7365-93 $\frac{2}{3}$ yard (0.61 m)
 (B) Ink-45** 1 yard (0.92 m)*
 (C) 7361-17 $\frac{5}{8}$ yard (0.58 m)
 (D) 1351-Pigment White+ 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards (1.15 m)
 (E) 7362-18 $\frac{1}{2}$ yard (0.46 m)
 (F) 7363-78 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ yards (1.26 m)
 (G) 7359-22 $\frac{1}{2}$ yard (0.46 m)
 (H) 7360-08 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ yards (1.72 m)
 (I) 7358-93 2 yards (1.83 m)

Backing

- 7364-22 4 yards (3.66 m)

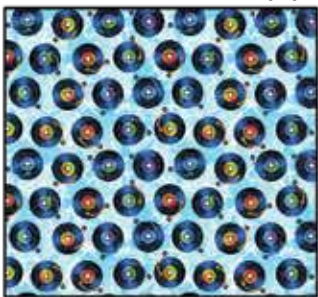

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7365-93 6.25-inch Blocks – Multi):

- Fussy cut (12) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (Ink-45 Peppered Cottons – Ink), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (7361-17 LP Records – Blue), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric D (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (2) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (8) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (72) 3 ⅞" squares.

Fabric E (7362-18 Drum Kit – Blue/Red), cut:

- (3) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ⅞" squares.

Fabric F (7363-78 Electric Guitars – Dark Blue), cut:

- (3) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (96) 4 ¼" triangles.
- (5) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.

Fabric G (7359-22 Stars – Pink), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.
- (2) 4 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) 4 ¼" triangles.

Fabric H (7360-08 Lightning Bolts – White), cut:

- (2) 2" x 62 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 2" x 50 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Fabric I (7358-93 Stadium Mew-sic Legends – Multi), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 65 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 ½" x 50 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Backing (7364-22 Words – Pink), cut:

- (2) 68" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 68" x 83" to make the back.

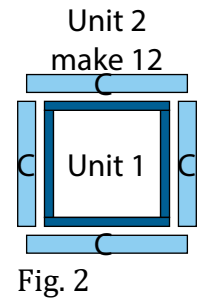
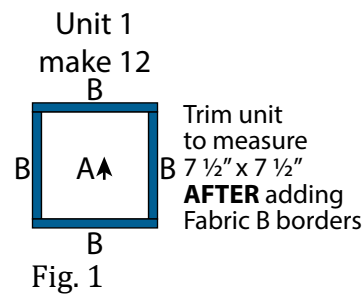
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

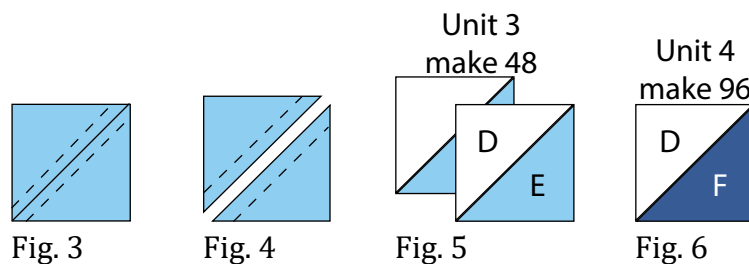
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square.** Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.

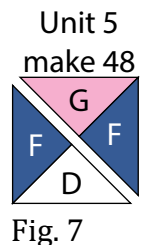


2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Unit 2 squares total.

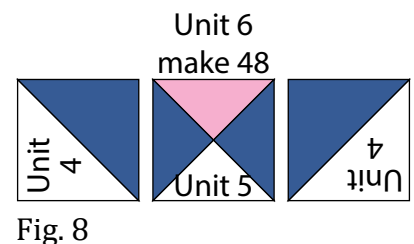
3. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (48) Unit 3 squares total.



5. Sew together (2) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F triangles, (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric G triangle and (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D triangle to make (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (48) Unit 5 squares total.



6. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (48) Unit 6 strips total.



7. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 6 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 15 ½" Block One square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.

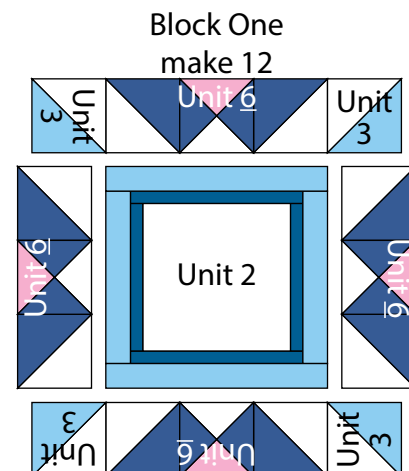

8. Sew together (3) Block One squares to make Row One (Fig. 10). Repeat to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.

9. Sew together the (4) Rows from Step 8, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 45 ½" x 60 ½" Center Block (Fig. 10).

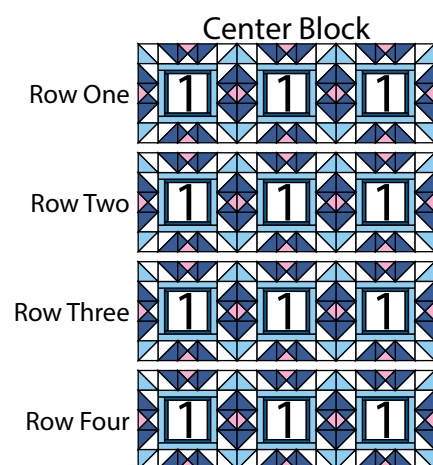

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

10. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Sew (1) 2" x 62 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 50 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

12. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 5 ½" Fabric G square to each end of (1) 5 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric I strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

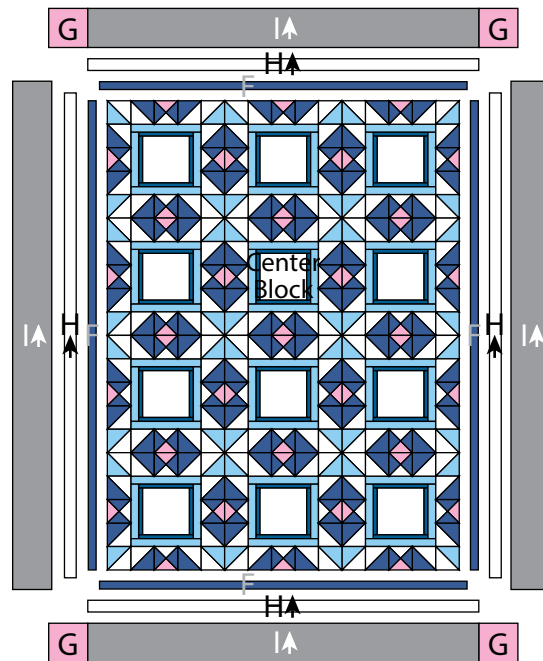
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

14. Press the quilt top and 68" x 83" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

15. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

16. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
