Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5947P-17 Panel 24-inches – Light Teal):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 39 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 46 ½" strips.

Fabric C (1351-Lava Just Color! – Lava), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 43 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 4" strips.

Fabric D (5943-1 Alphabet – White):

- Fussy cut (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 4" x 5 ½" strips.

Fabric E (5936-1 Multi-Dot – White), cut:

- (1) 4" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4" x 5 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5938-17 Alligator – Light Teal), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 6 ½" x 4 ½" strips and (4) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric G (5939-90 Zebra – Gray), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips and (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric H (5940-1 Rhino – White), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips and (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric I (5941-33 Lion – Yellow), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips and (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric J (5946-1 Allover Character – White), cut:

- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 56 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 46 ½" strips.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric K (5942-33 Giraffe – Yellow), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric L (5945-22 Elephant – Pink), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (2) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric M (5944-1 Flamingo – White), cut:

- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric N (1351-Denim Just Color! – Denim), cut:

- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (5943-1 Alphabet – White), cut:

- (2) 64" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 64" x 74" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $2'' \times 39 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $22 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 39 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $2'' \times 25 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure $24 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 41 \frac{1}{2}''$.**

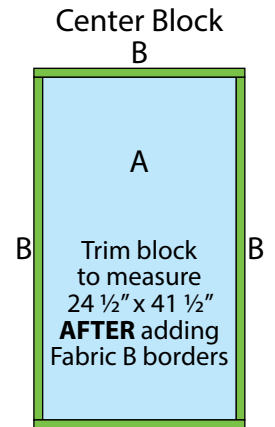

2. Follow Figure 2 and sew together (6) assorted $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 6 \frac{1}{2}''$ strips and (5) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 4 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strips to make the left column.

3. Follow Figure 2 and sew together (4) $4'' \times 5 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D strips, (6) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 4''$ Fabric C strips and (3) $4'' \times 5 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E strips to make the right column.

4. Sew the left column from Step 2 to the left side of (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 41 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strip. Sew the right column from Step 3 to the right side of the Fabric C strip to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 2).

5. Repeat Steps 2-4 and refer to Figure 3 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border.

6. Follow Figure 4 and sew together (2) $4 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric F squares, (4) assorted $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 7 \frac{1}{2}''$ strips and (5) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 4 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strips to make the Top Border.

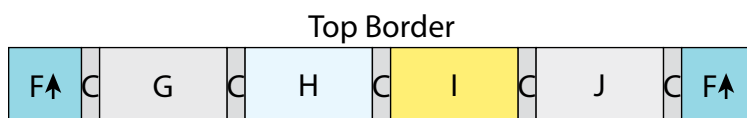

7. Follow Figure 5 and sew together (2) $4 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric F squares, (4) assorted $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 7 \frac{1}{2}''$ strips and (5) $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 4 \frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strips to make the Bottom Border.

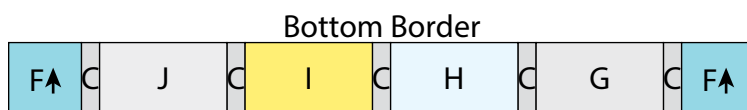

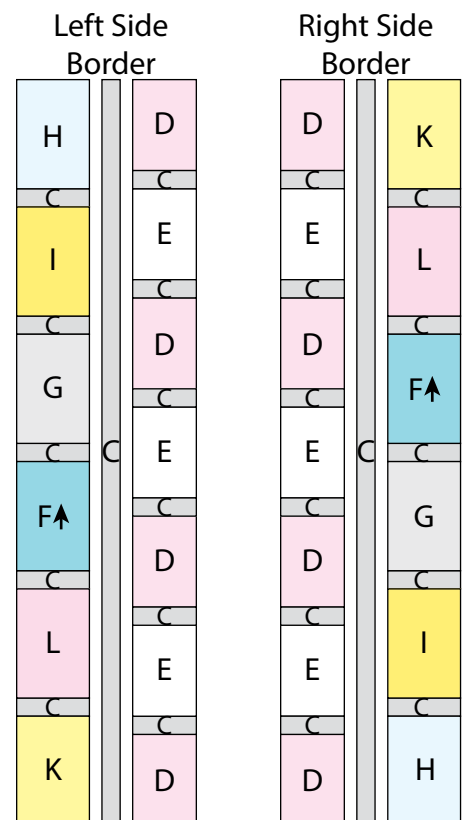

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

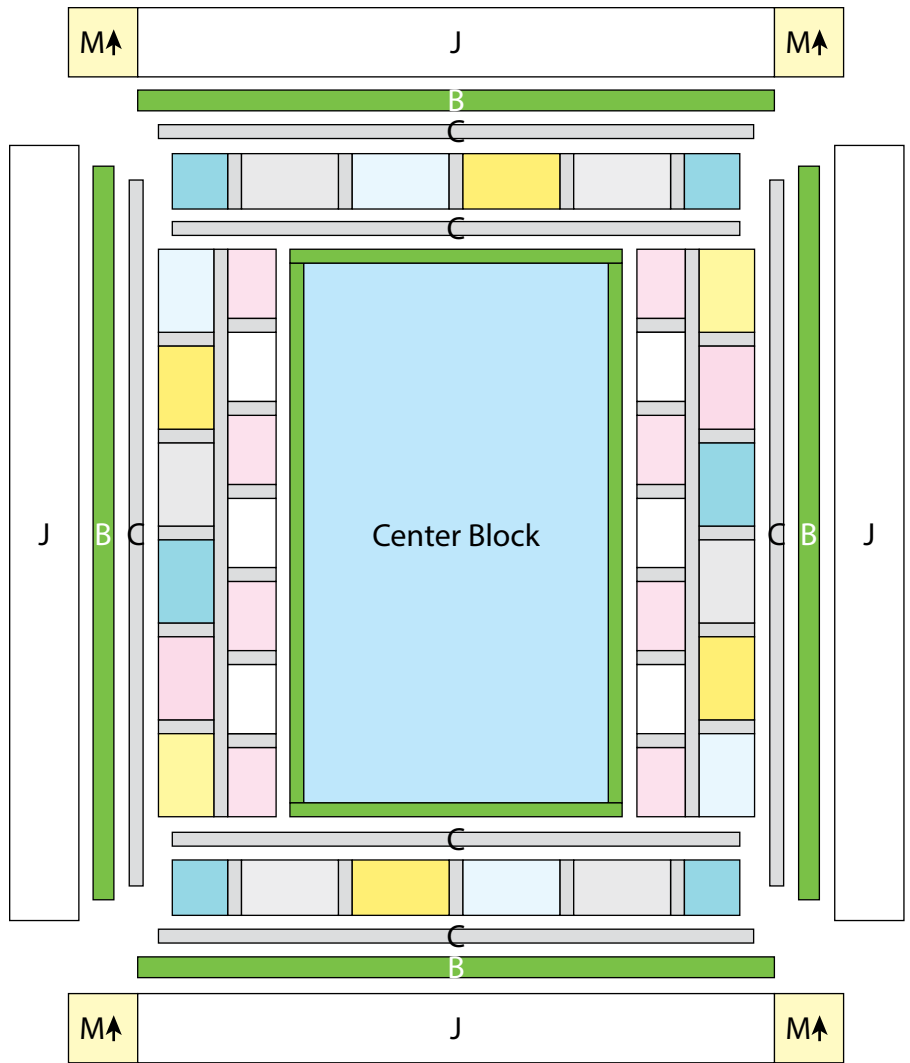
8. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
10. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) 2" x 53 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 46 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) 5 ½" Fabric M square to each end of (1) 5 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric J strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 64" x 74" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric N binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
