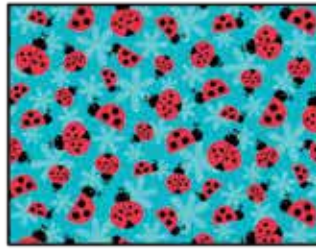

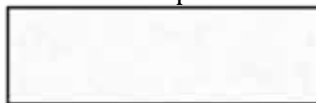

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6697-2 Butterfly Allover – Multi), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric B (6698-11 Ladybug Allover – Aqua), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric C (6701-44 Monotone Small Floral – Yellow), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric D (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (144) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric E (6698-22 Ladybug Allover – Pink), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (6703-26 Tossed Motifs – Multi), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 6 ½" squares.

Fabric G (6704-44 Snails – Yellow), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

Fabric H (6701-11 Monotone Small Floral – Aqua), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric I (6704-22 Snails – Pink), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric J (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (31) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (62) 1 ¼" x 14 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric K (6705-21 Small Multicolored Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (16) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 2" x 14 ½" strips.

Fabric L (6700-11 Floral and Butterfly Allover – Aqua), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 3 ½" squares.

Backing (6702-21 Motifs in Vine Circles – Multi), cut:

- (2) 62" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 62" x 79" to make the back.

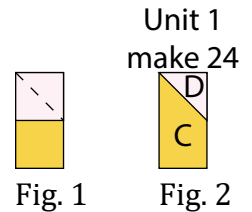
Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

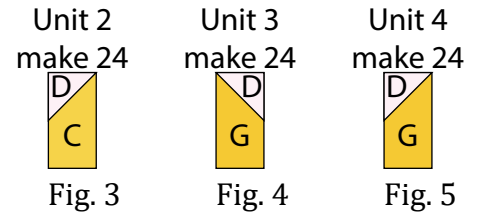
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

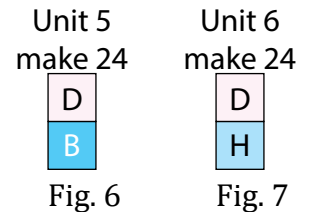
1. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the top half of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together and aligning the tops of the fabrics (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.



2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 2 strips, (24) Unit 3 strips and (24) Unit 4 strips.

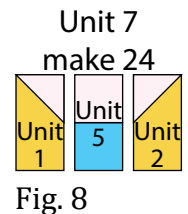


3. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (24) Unit 5 strips total.

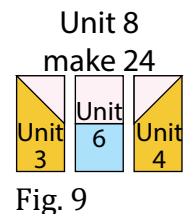


4. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Unit 6 strips total.

5. Sew together (1) Unit 1 strip, (1) Unit 5 strip and (1) Unit 2 strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 7 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (24) Unit 7 strips total.



6. Sew together (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 6 strip and (1) Unit 4 strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 8 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (24) Unit 8 strips total.

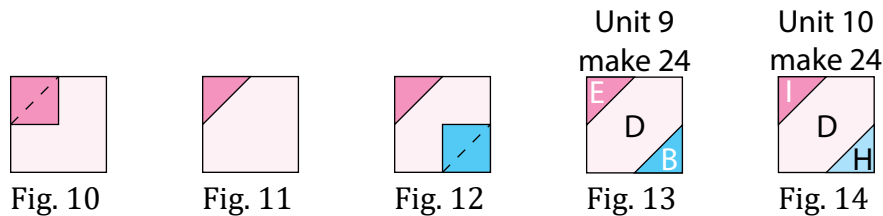


7. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 11). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.

8. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric B square to the lower right corner of the 4 ½" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 13).

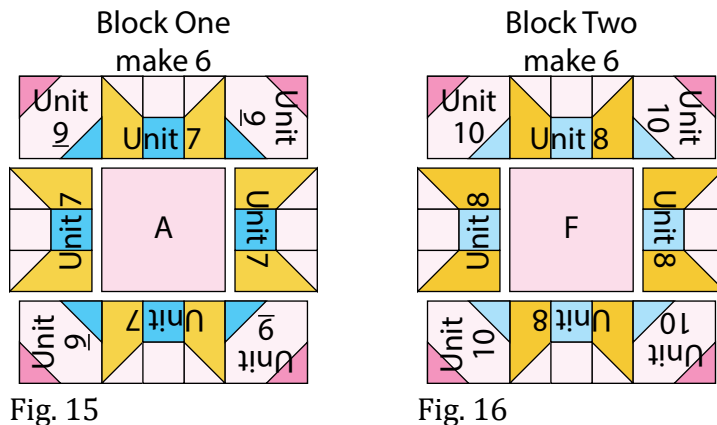
9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make (24) Unit 9 squares total.

10. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 14 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 10 squares.

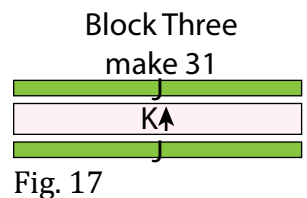


11. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to each end of (1) Unit 7 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14 ½" Block One square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figure 16 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.



13. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2" x 14 ½" Fabric K strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Three strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (31) Block Three strips total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

14. Sew together (4) 3 ½" Fabric L squares and (3) Block Three strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three, Row Five, Row Seven and Row Nine.

15. Sew together (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Six.

16. Sew together (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Three strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block Three strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row Four. Repeat to make Row Eight.

17. Sew together the (9) Rows from Steps 14-16, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.

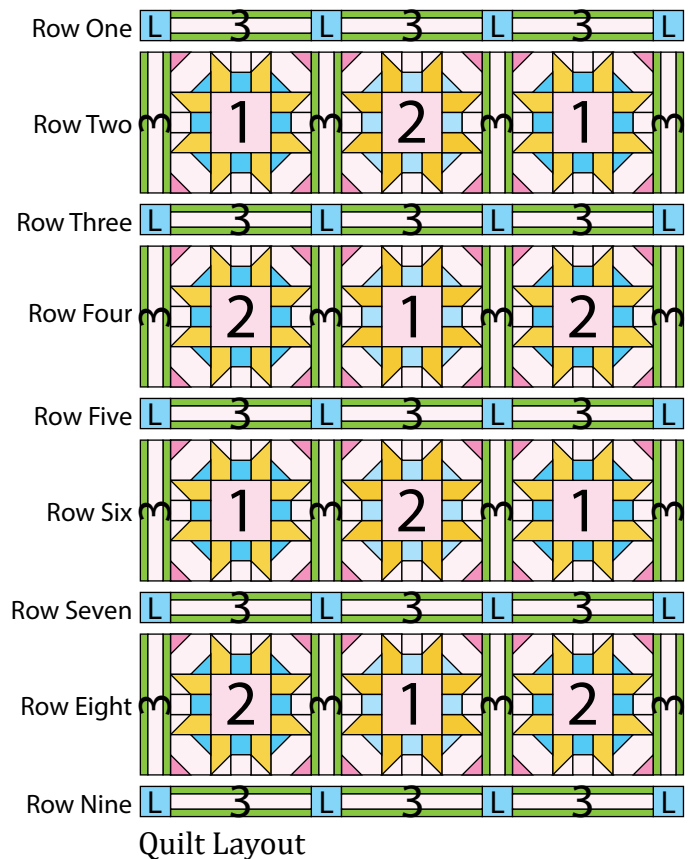
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

18. Press the quilt top and 62" x 79" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

19. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric J binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

20. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
