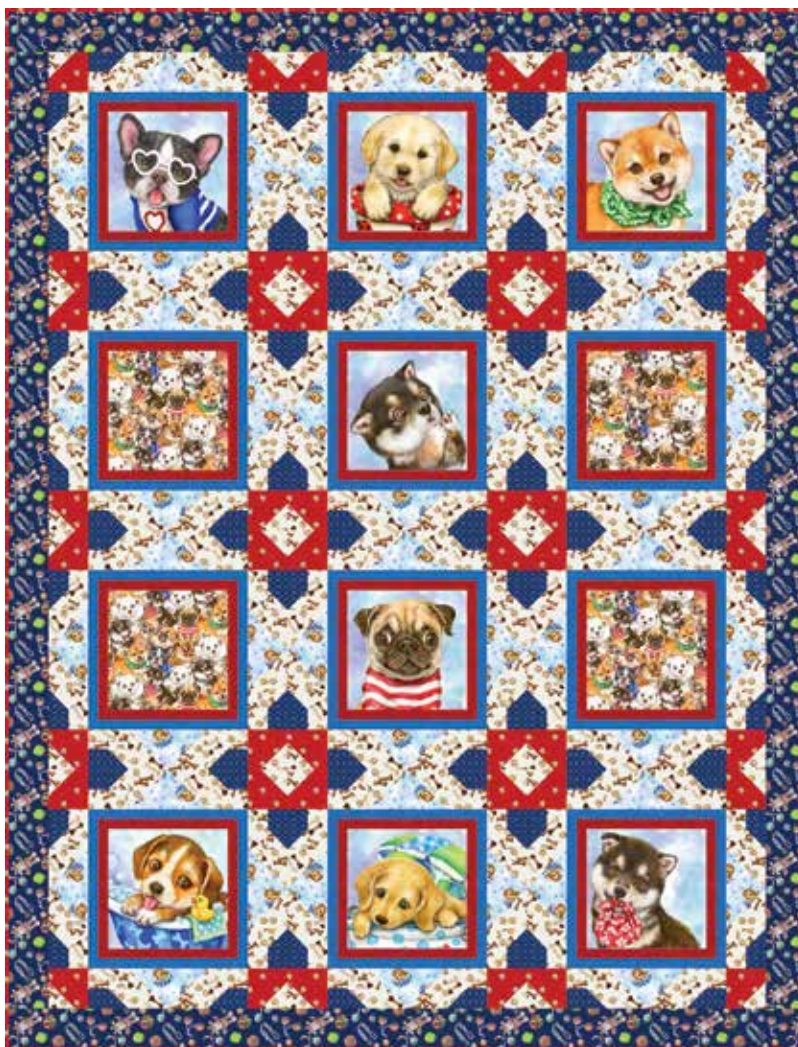

 (C) 1351-Aegean Blue** $\frac{2}{3}$ yard
 (D) 6887-11 $\frac{7}{8}$ yard
 (E) 6891-39 1 $\frac{7}{8}$ yards
 (F) 6890-77 $\frac{5}{8}$ yard
 (G) 6892-88 1 yard*
 (H) 6893-77 $\frac{7}{8}$ yard

- (I) 6886-35 $\frac{3}{8}$ yard
 Backing
 6886-35 5 yards

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6895P-77 24-Block Panel – Navy):

- Fussy cut (8) 9 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (1351-Red Delicious Just Color! – Red Delicious), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ¼" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ¼" x 11" strips.

Fabric C (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color! – Aegean Blue), cut:

- (8) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ¼" x 11" strips.
- (8) 1 ¼" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ¼" x 12 ½" strips.

Fabric D (6887-11 Puppy in Bathtub – Light Blue), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

Fabric E (6891-39 Tossed Allover Bones – Ecru), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 3 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2" squares.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

Fabric F (6890-77 Argyle – Navy), cut:

- (8) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

Fabric G (6892-88 Beach Ball Dot – Red), cut:

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 3 ½" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric H (6893-77 Toys Allover – Navy), cut:

- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 72 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 60 ½" strips.

Fabric I (6886-35 Packed Puppies – Tan), cut:

- (1) 9 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 9 ½" squares.

Backing (6886-35 Packed Puppies – Tan), cut:

- (2) 86" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 68" x 86" to make the back.

Sewing

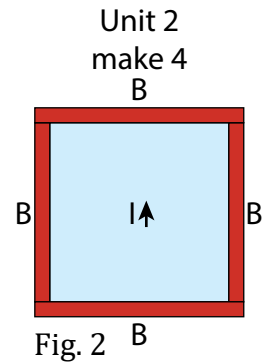
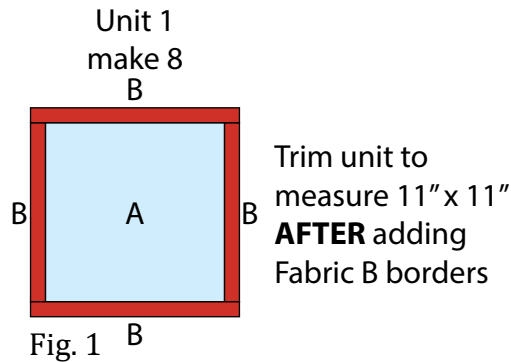
Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

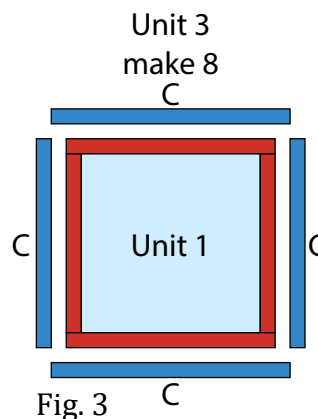
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) $2'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $9\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric A square. Sew (1) $2'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure $11'' \times 11''$.** Repeat to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.

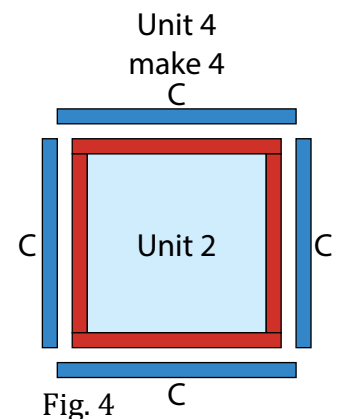
2. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 9\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric B strip to each side (1) $9\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric I square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 11''$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.



3. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 11''$ Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}''$ Unit 3 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (8) Unit 3 squares total.



4. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 11''$ Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}''$ Unit 4 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.



5. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E square on the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance (Fig. 6).

6. Place another $3\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric E square on the right side of the $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}''$ seam allowance to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 8).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (48) Unit 5 strips total.

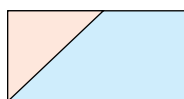

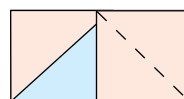

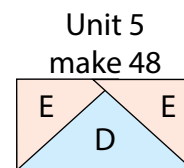

8. Place (1) 2" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (48) Unit 6 strips total.

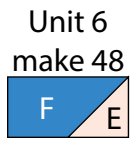

9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (48) Unit 7 strips.

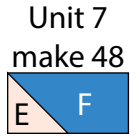

10. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to the top of (1) 2" x 3 ½" Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (48) Unit 8 squares total.

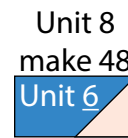

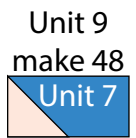

11. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the top of (1) 2" x 3 ½" Fabric E strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (48) Unit 9 squares total.

12. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) 3 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 10 square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (48) Unit 10 squares total.

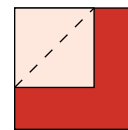

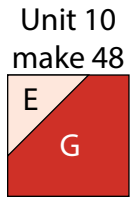

13. Sew together (1) Unit 8 square, (1) Unit 5 strip and (1) Unit 9 square, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (48) Unit 11 strips total.

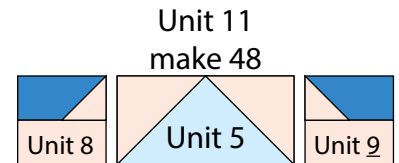

14. Sew (1) Unit 10 square to each end of (1) Unit 11 strip to make (1) Unit 12 strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (24) Unit 12 strips total.

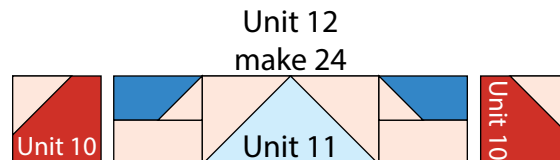

15. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 18 ½" Block One square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (8) Block One squares total.

16. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip to the top and to the bottom of the newly sewn strip to make (1) 18 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

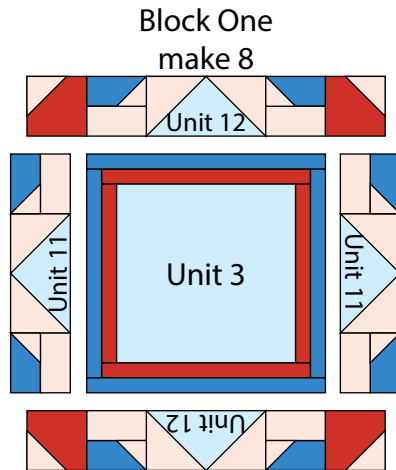

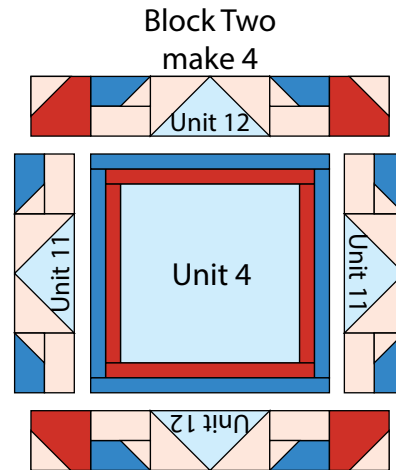

17. Sew together (3) Block One squares to make Row One (Fig. 20). Repeat to make Row Four.

18. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 20). Repeat to make Row Three.

19. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 17-18, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 54 ½" x 72 ½" Center Block (Fig. 20).

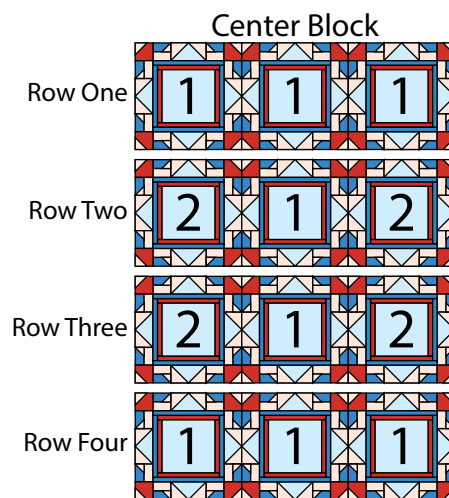

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

20. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

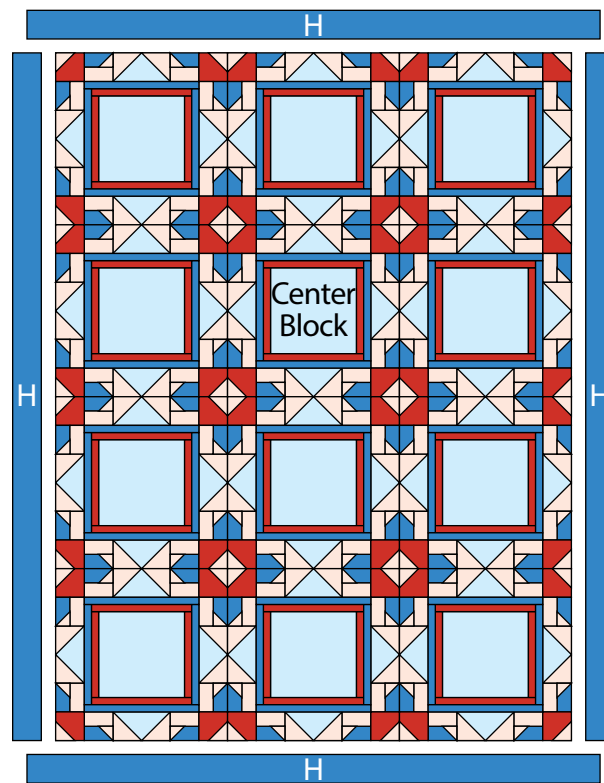
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

21. Press the quilt top and 68" x 86" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

22. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric G binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

23. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
